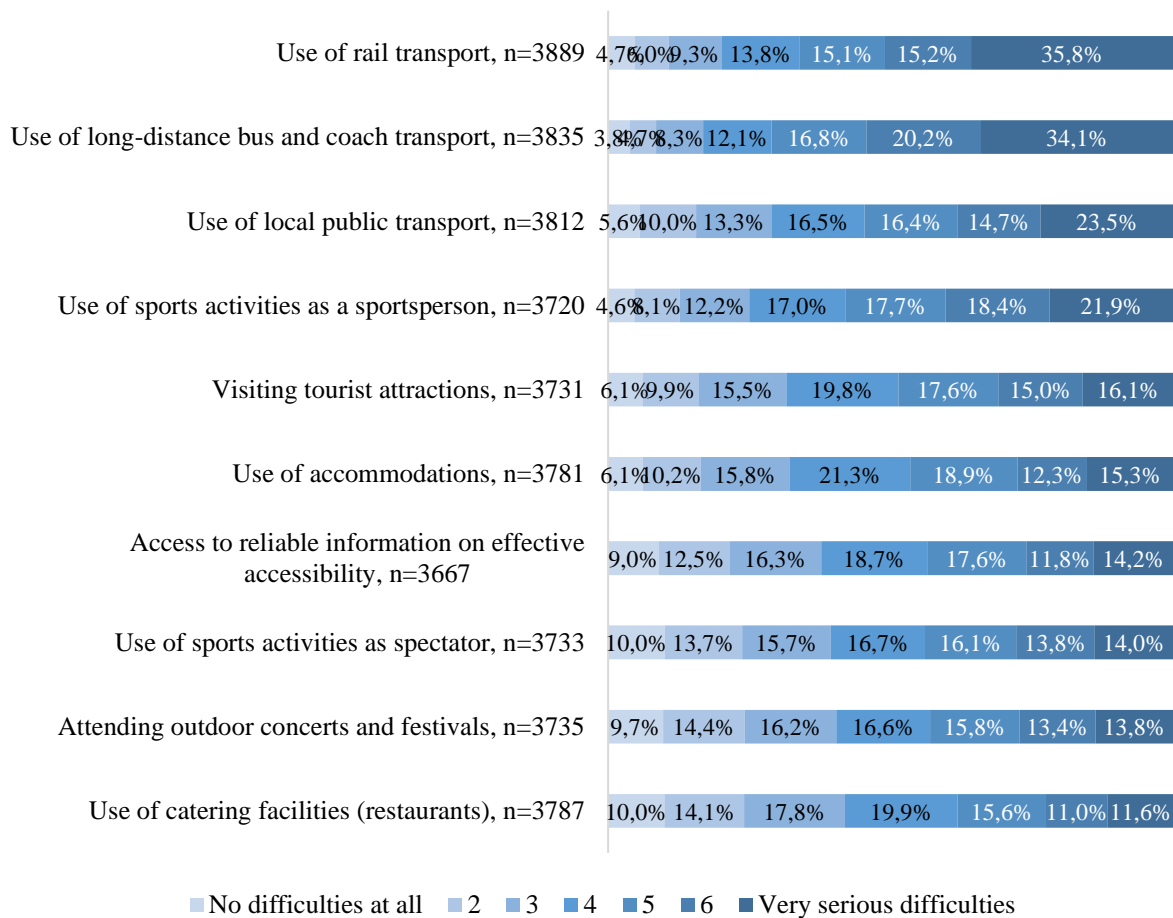

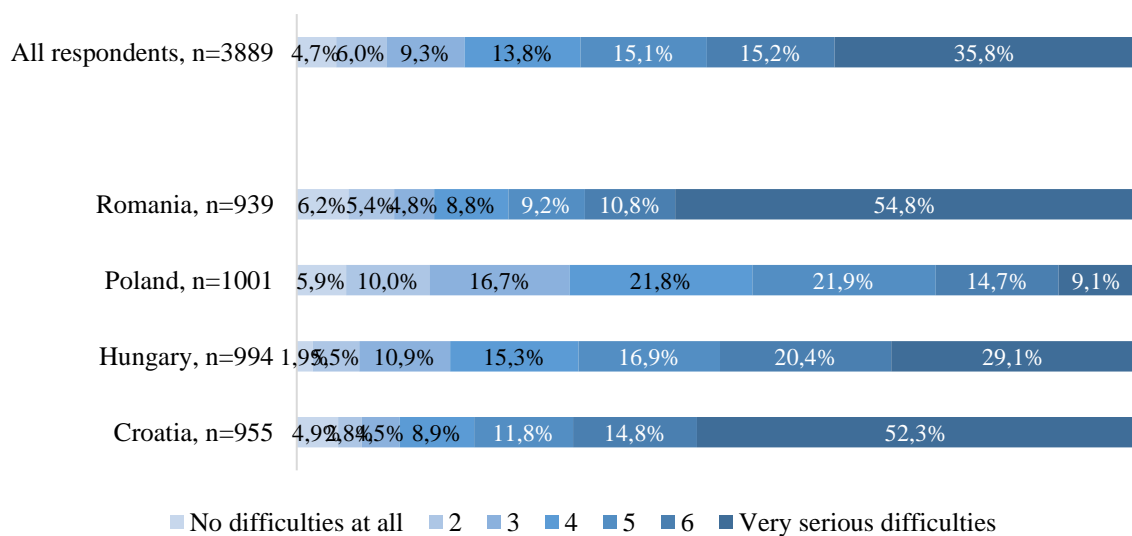

In general, what level of difficulties do you think people with disabilities face in the following areas? (1: No difficulties at all; 7: very serious difficulties faced by people with disabilities.)

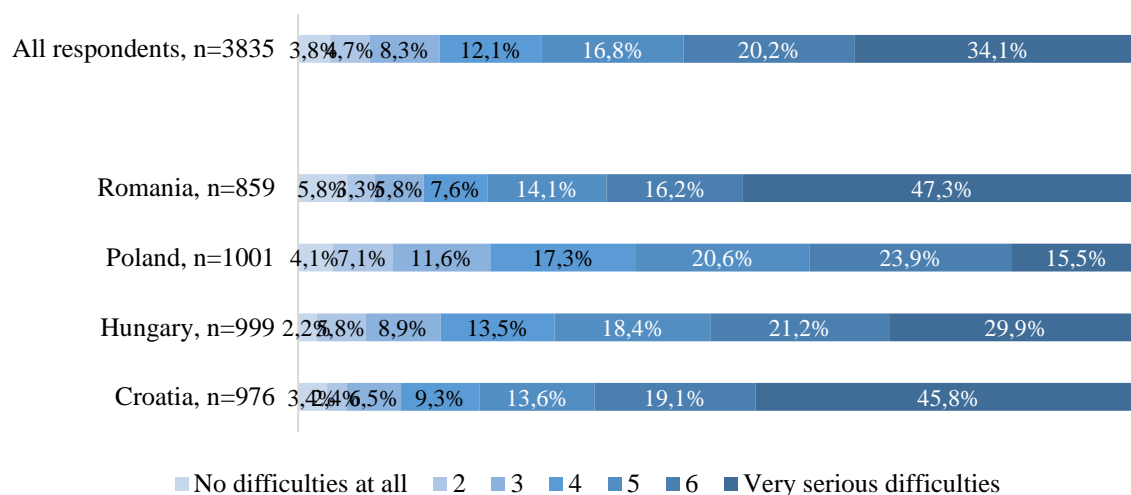

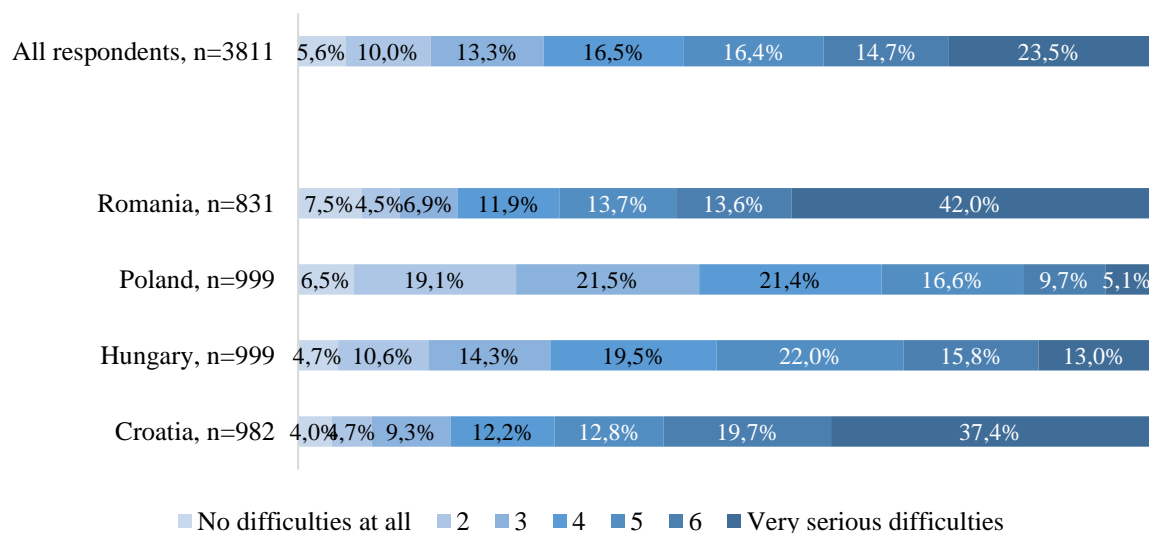
Use of rail transport



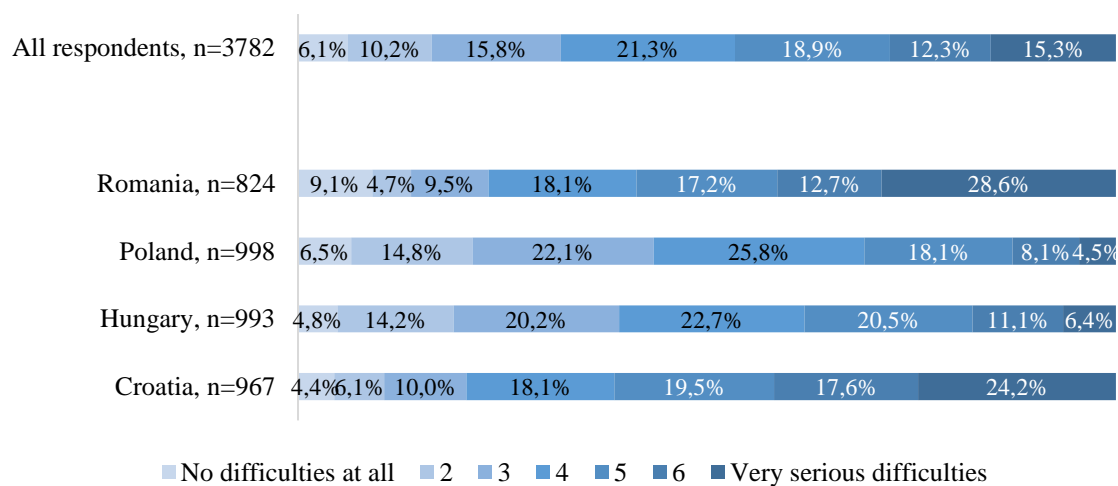
Use of long-distance bus and coach transport



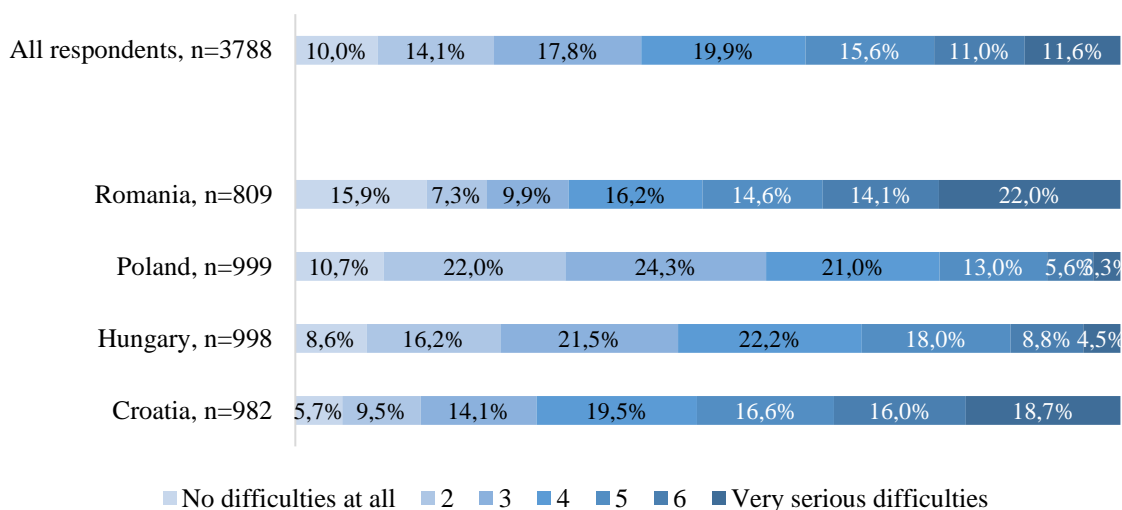
Use of local public transport



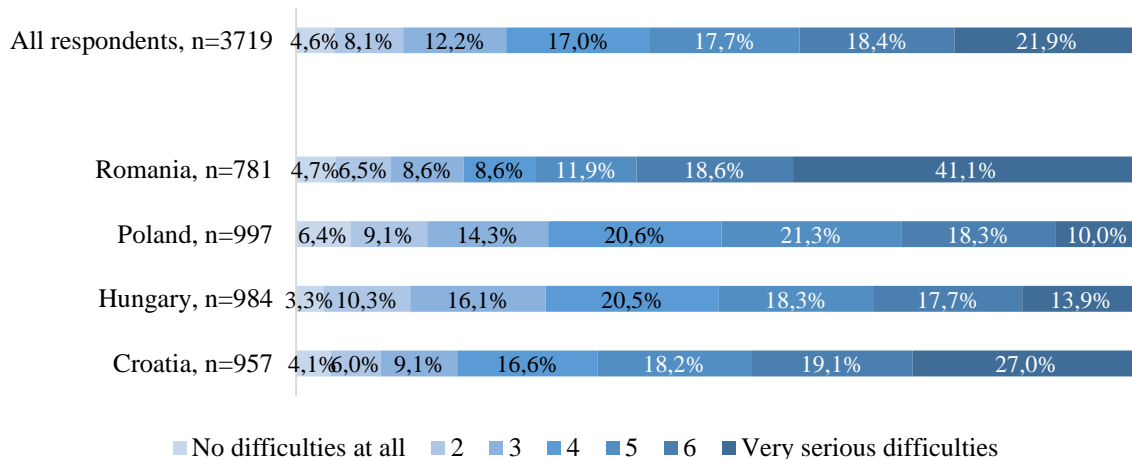
Use of accommodations, n=3781



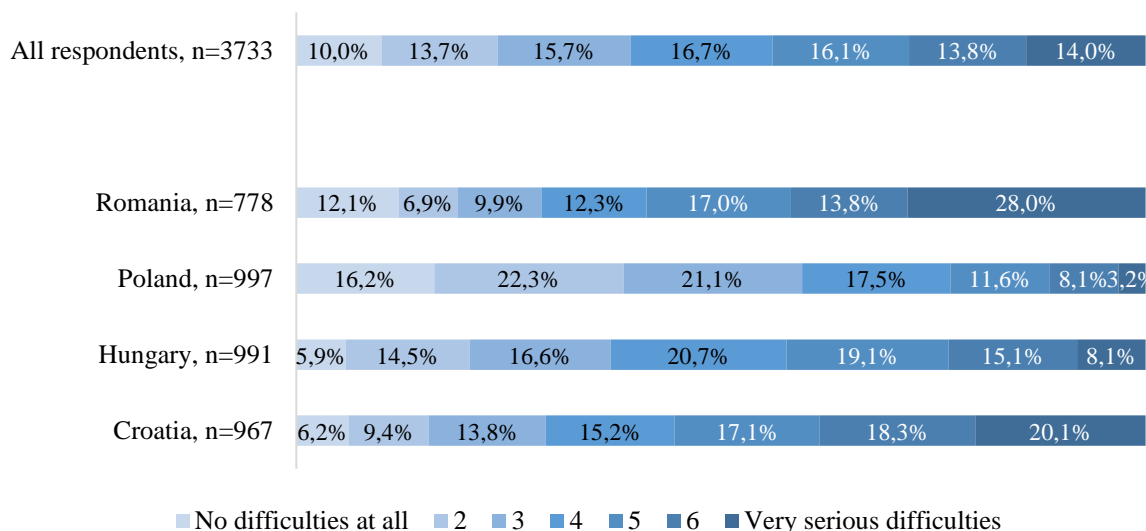
Use of catering facilities (restaurants)



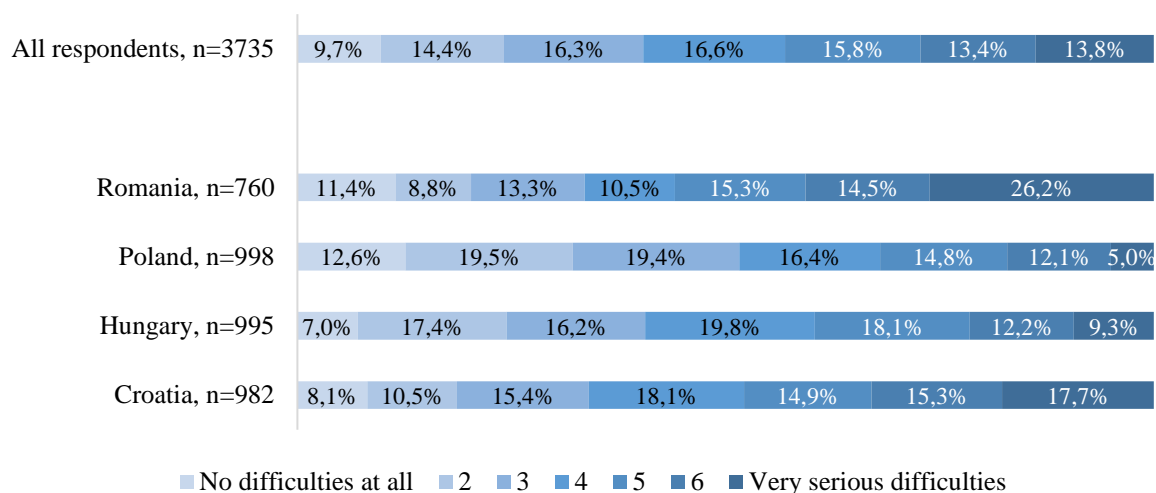

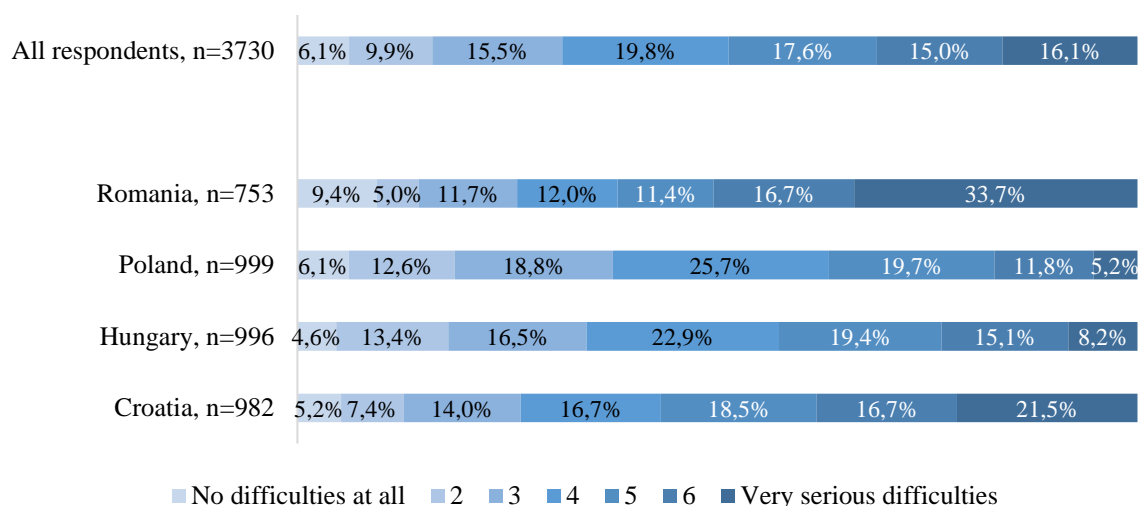

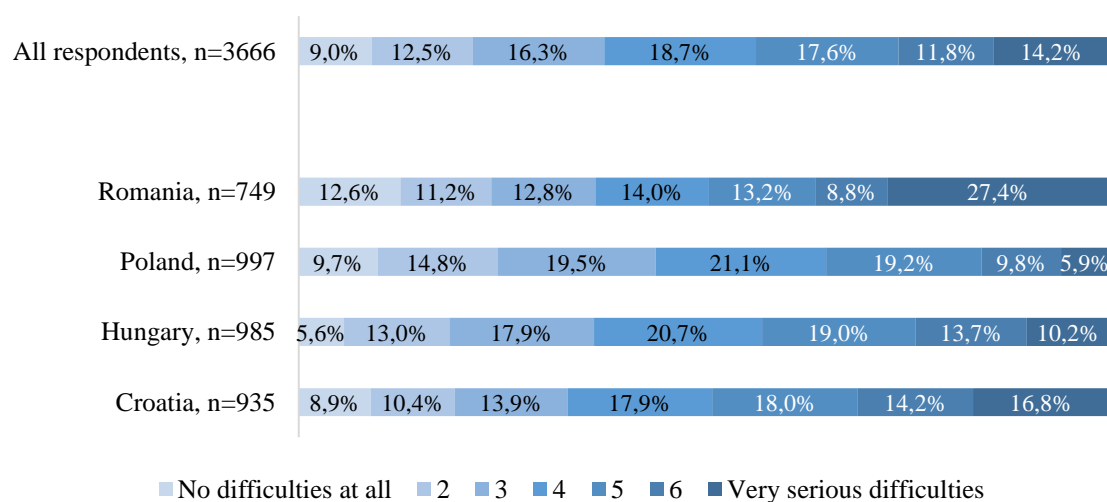

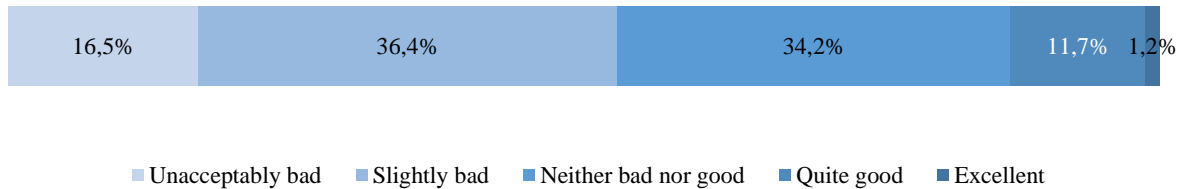

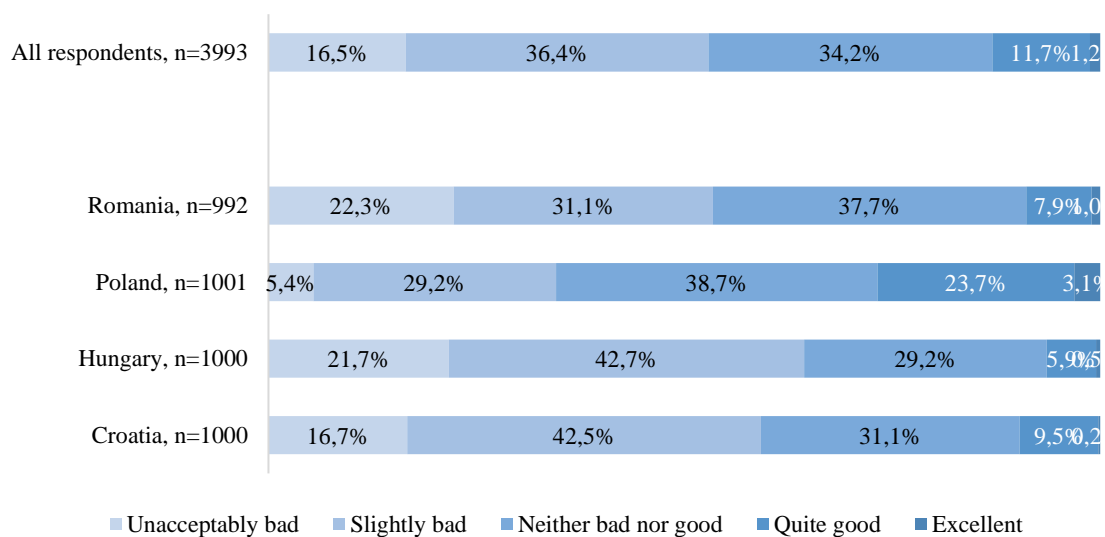

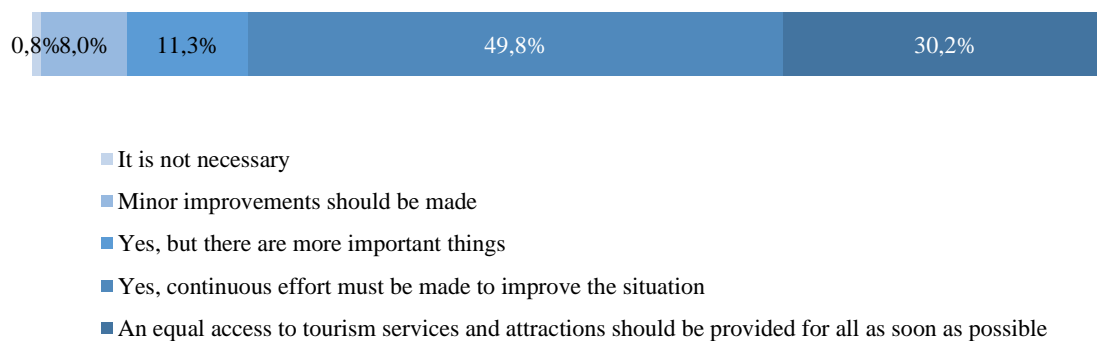
In general, what opportunities do you think people with disabilities in your country have in participation in tourism?



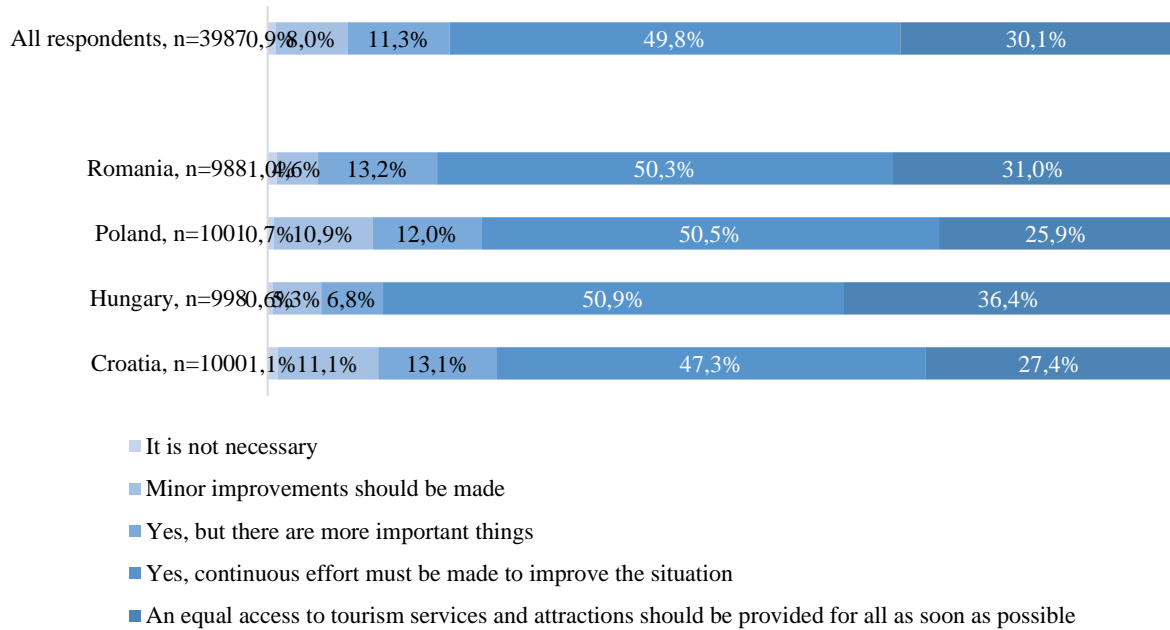

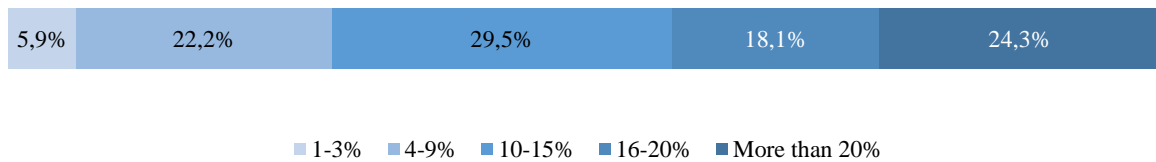
Do you think that the situation of accessible tourism should be improved in your country?



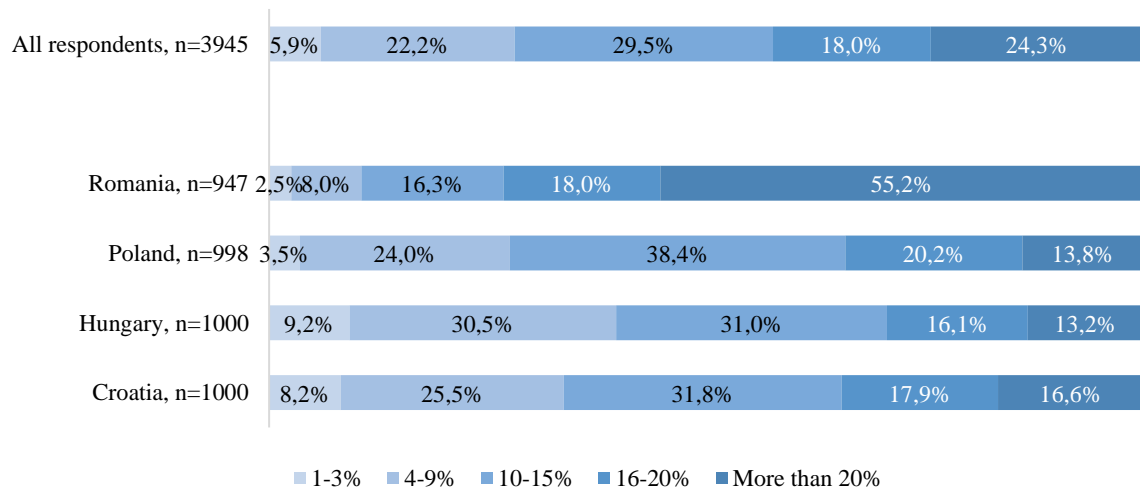

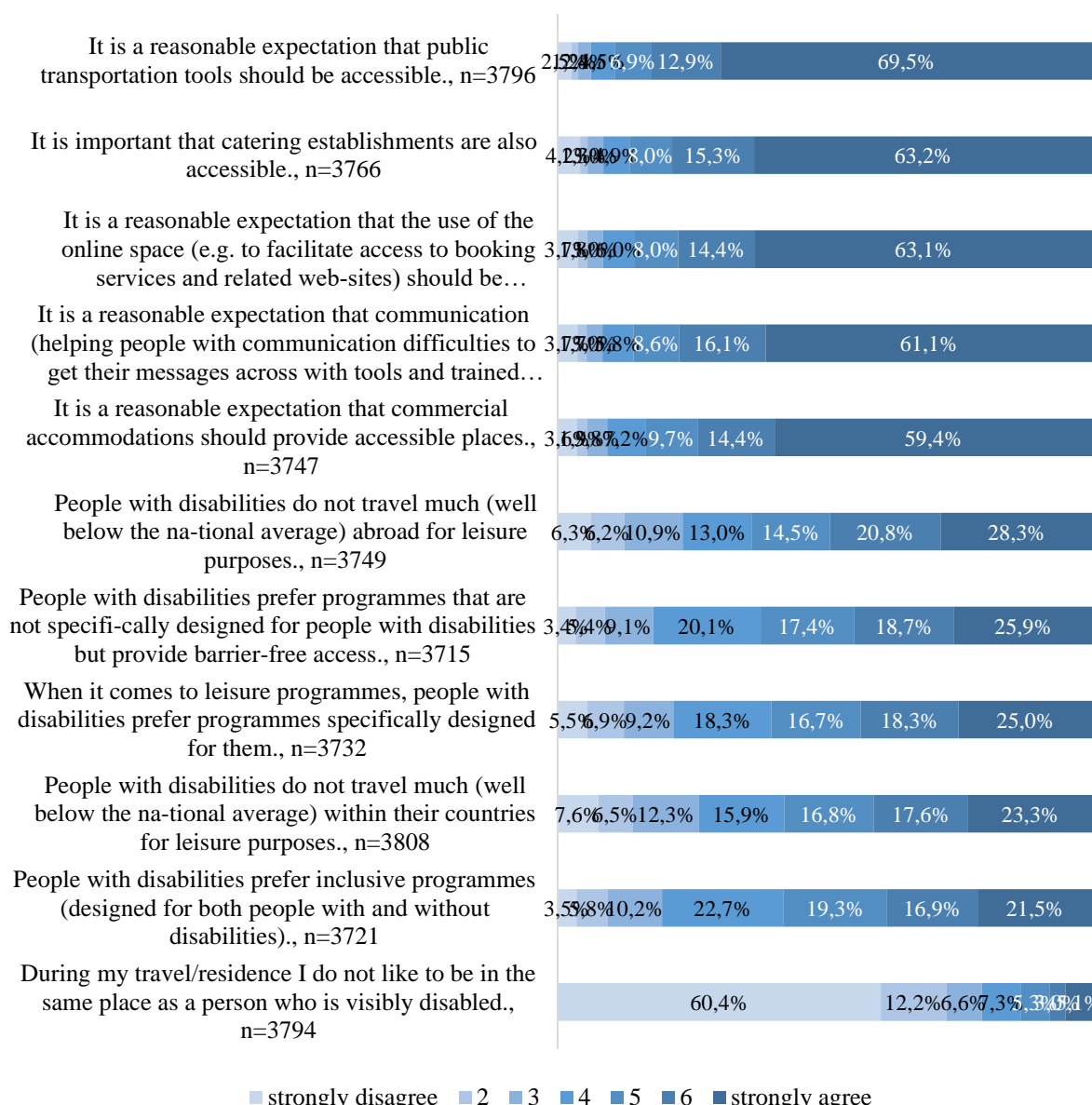
What percentage of the domestic population do you think could be the target group of accessible tourism?



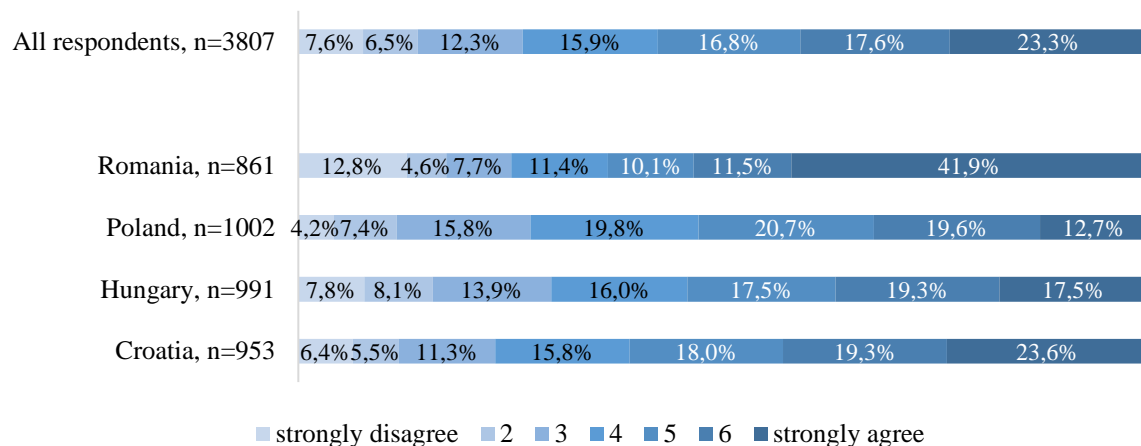

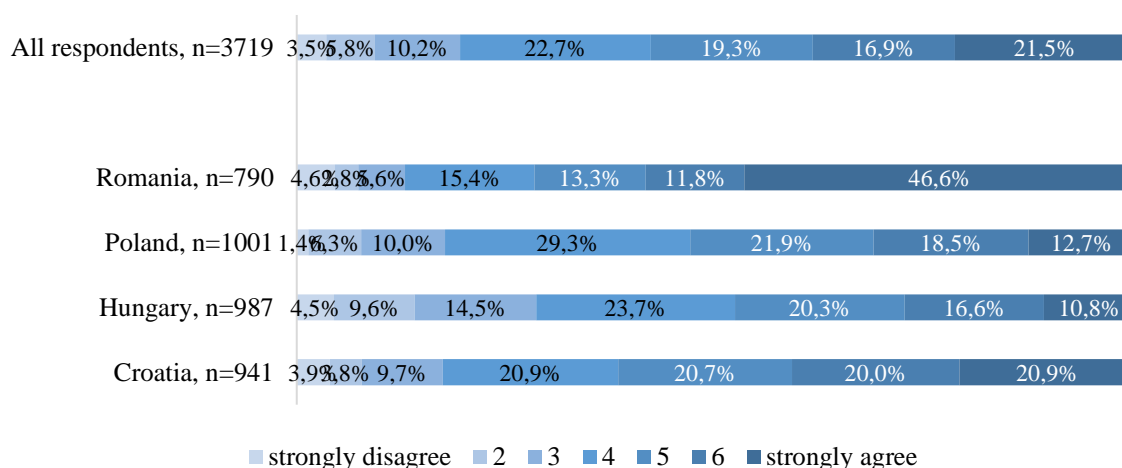

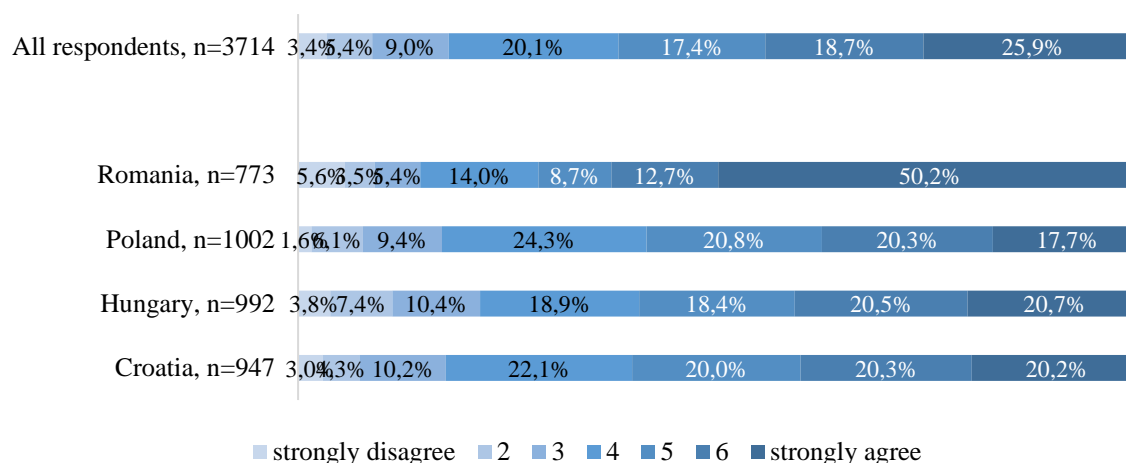

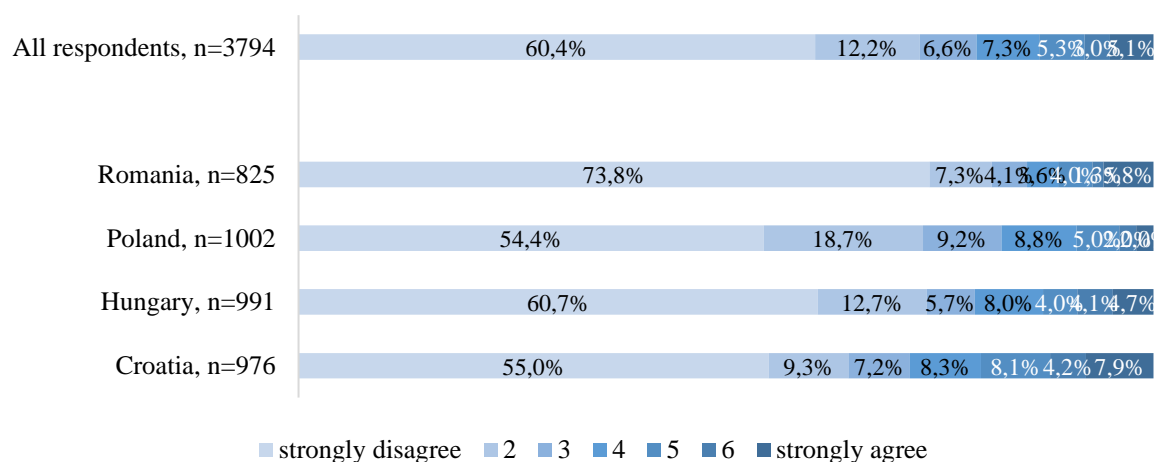

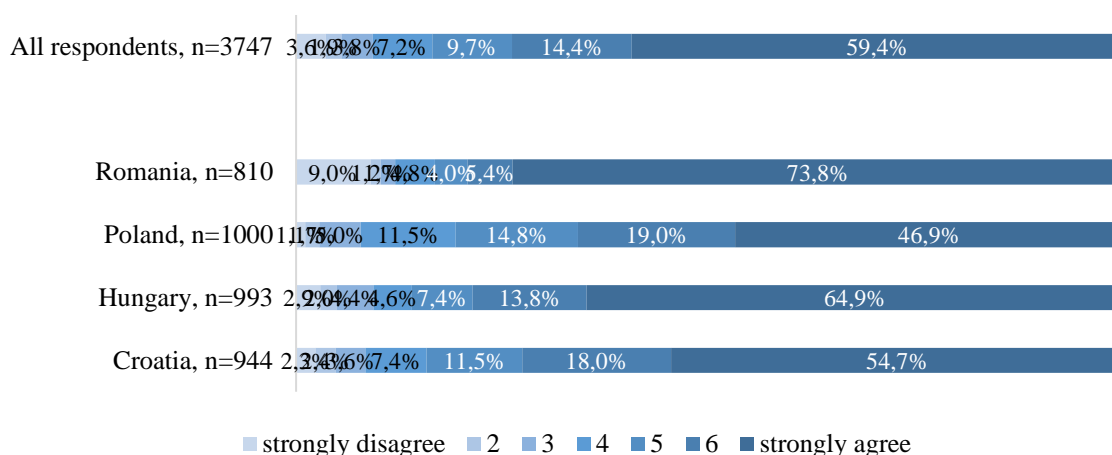
